Personal Statement

As has always been the case, the coming years are likely to bring new challenges to our Orthodox Church in America. We will have to dynamically seek to connect our Orthodox dogmatic and canonical Tradition to the pastoral needs of the contemporary Church in America, employing new ideas while remaining faithful to that Tradition. Moreover, we face the continued challenge of helping us all to fully understand our missionary calling to do the apostolic work of the Church, rather than just serving the immediate and insular needs of our parish communities. As the rector of a rapidly growing legacy parish in Western Pennsylvania, I have had to do just this, both delving into the depths of our tradition while leading and encouraging my parishioners to find new ways to help connect us with that tradition, all while helping the parish to understand our Orthodox Church in America's mission and vision. If the All-American Council would have me, I would like to bring my experiences within the parish to the Metropolitan Council, and to contribute to working to address these struggles faced by the entire OCA.

In particular, I am concerned about the impending clergy shortage facing our OCA - a challenge already besetting us here in Western PA. I would like to help find ways for our Church to address this issue, which is why I have been part of the Intentional Discipleship for Ministry discussions led by Fr. John Parker (Dean of STOTS). I hope that I might be able to bring some of these insights to the discussion of the broader Church, if called upon to do so as a member of the Metropolitan Council.

As an Army Officer, I have served on countless councils, working groups, and operational planning teams. At this stage in my career, I serve at the strategic planning level at the Headquarters of the Department of the Army in the Pentagon.

I founded Thelma's Kitchen, KC's first pay-it-forward café, and recently led a \$15.5M redevelopment of our 26,000 sq/ft facility. I was founding Executive Director of FOCUS North America, am an Aspen Institute Civil Society Fellow, co-founder of the Social Venture Studio, author of The Social Leader e-course, and serve on multiple national and local boards of directors.

For over 25 years, I've worked to integrate faith with action to advocate for the poor and marginalized, which is central to our Church's mission and witness in America.
